#### Donate a source of light

##### Needs analysis

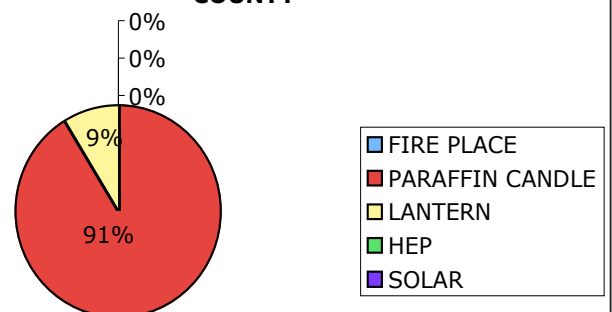
91% of our focal communities in rural Kayunga Sub County are suffering from inevitable danger by using paraffin candles. These are made by placing a wick, commonly using old rags, in a tin full of oil.

While the initial costs are inexpensive, the long term effects are costly as many fall ill or are even killed by prolonged exposure to the respiratory system from soot causing lung cancer, sinusitis, pneumonia and bronchitis. Paraffin candles are also responsible for many house fires.

##### Donation required

You can save a home or more by donating  
**\$10** to buy a hurricane lantern  
**\$30** to buy a solar rechargeable lantern  
**\$800** to install a solar lighting system

## Support a child in attending a UPE School



### Need analysis

2700 children in the rural Kayunga Sub County need support with scholastic material, fees for lunch, school uniform and shoes that will enable them to attend the government tuition-free Universal Primary Education schools. From our survey, 89% of the community earns less than \$50 a month and it is very common to find people making less than \$2.5 a month.

### Donation required

You can help a child attend a UPE school by contributing **\$185**.

**\$85** covers the first four-month term by purchasing:

lunch fees: **\$20**

a school uniform: **\$20**

shoes: **\$15**

and scholastic materials: **\$30**

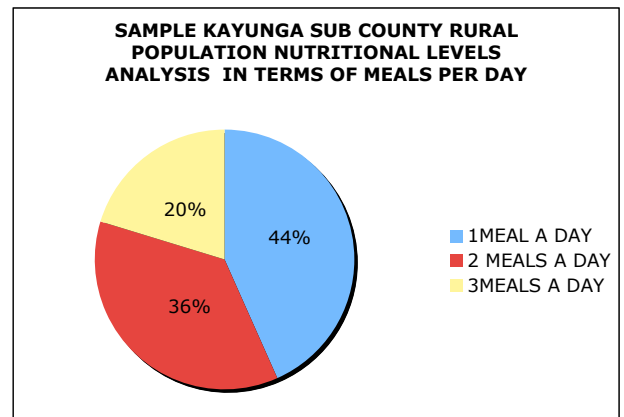
The remaining \$100 covers all lunch fees and scholastic materials for the rest of the year (the remaining four month terms).

## Support an Orphaned Vulnerable Child (OVC) household

### Need analysis

The OVC prevalence rate in the rural Kayunga Sub County according to the survey carried out is 44%. BUVAD intends to support 300 OVC households with clothes, food and income generating activity start up. From the survey, 44% of the population only eats 1 meal a day. There is an impending danger of famine in the area which has already struck the district of Teso, killing many people and forcing some to migrate to neighbouring districts like Kayunga, adding stress to a dire situation.



### Donation required

You can help an OVC household push ahead in life by donating:

**\$50** covers food support for 2 months (family of 6)

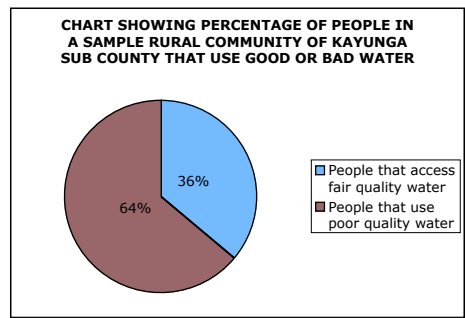
**\$50** for basic household needs

**\$150** for an Income Generating Activity (IGA) start up.

**Support the completion of community safe water well or another hand dug well**



**Need analysis.**

64% of the community surveyed uses bad water and only 36% can afford fair quality water. The water used by many is run off that collects in water holes during the rainy season that evaporates in the dry season. In the dry season, most of the community uses the last resort the saline corrosive, black, or brown silvery covered Sezibwa swamp, 6kms away from the main road.

**Donation required.**

You can help to complete the community hand dug well or help to dig another one. 72 wells are needed to cover the 8 parishes of Kayunga Sub County. An average cost per well \$3500

You can buy:

- one sack of cement: **\$15**
- one culvert ring (an average of 10 are used per well): **\$55**
- one day's labour for ten people: **\$50**
- one heap of river sand: **\$60**
- one heap of lake sand: **\$70**
- one heap of stones: **\$65**
- hand pump: **\$855**

## Support the construction of a house or a toilet for a disadvantaged home

### Need analysis.

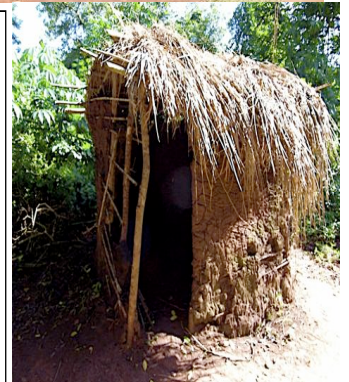
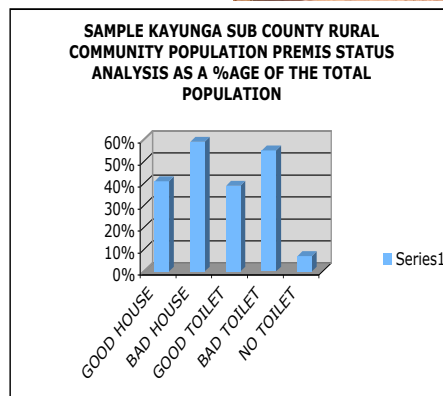
A tour around the village leaves you wondering how people survive in the houses they live in - some are on the verge of collapsing, some have no permanent roof, others have no permanent walls. Nearly 90% of the houses in the area are in poor status. The toilets are pit latrines and when these are in poor status, they are in danger of collapsing.



### Donation required.

You can help contribute towards the construction of a safe house or toilet for needy people by contributing one or all of these items:

- one sheet of corrugated iron: **\$10**
- one sack of cement: **\$15**
- one heap of river sand: **\$60**
- 500 baked bricks: **\$10**
- nails: **\$20**
- assorted timber: **\$50**
- one day labour for ten people: **\$50**
- a heap of concrete stones: **\$65**



## Support the set up of a cooking oil mill to extract oil from sunflowers grown by people we serve for income improvement of the communities and self sustainability of the organization.

### Need analysis.

One of the major challenges for the rural communities of Kayunga Sub County is the lack of stable income. Likewise, one of the key challenges to our organization's management is self sustainability. According to our survey, the habit of planting perennial crops keeps residents perpetually poor. Perennial crops consume a lot of arable land space that can be better use by commercial seasonal crops. If a perennial crop like coffee has a poor yield in a given year that means a whole year of poverty. There is need for a crop that is marketable, can be grow along side other crops and can yield more than one crop a year. Sunflower oil has a local, national, and international market. BUVAD intends to set up a co-op and build a processing centre for production of oil. The project has the capacity to cover its own running costs and a co-op partner, BUVAD shall also be in a position to earn a small surplus that can be used to cover administrative costs. This will be one of BUVAD's biggest undertakings and has a potential to greatly impact this area on all levels. Given its success in the focal area, this project can then be expanded to the entire district.

### **Needs analysis.**

BUVAD is a volunteer run, grassroots organization and in the past has had a challenge offer a house for international volunteers. The community has donated a western style house with capacity of accommodating 10 or more volunteers to BUVAD. This house (*shown in the photo*) needs polishing, painting, solar power installation, replacement of door locks, a few

windowpanes replaced, light fixture and a water tank.



### **Donation required.**

You can support this project by contributing towards at least one or of the following:

Solar lighting system: **\$1500**  
 8000ltr water tank to harvest rainwater: **\$1000**  
 One sack of cement: **\$15**  
 5 litres of paint: **\$10**  
 Roller brush: **\$5**  
 Window glass: **\$10**  
 Door lock: **\$15**  
 One metre of window screen: **\$5**  
 Mosquito net: **\$10**  
 One mattress: **\$30**  
 One bed frame: **\$40**  
 One blanket: **\$15**  
 One set of bed sheets: **\$10**  
 Miscellaneous room furniture: **\$50**  
 One day's labor for 10 men: **\$50**

You can help the people in the rural communities of our focal areas get out of poverty by donating an income generating activity start up to a family.

**Need analysis.**

According to our survey, nearly all the homes within the rural communities of Kayunga Sub County earned income below the living wage. The major challenge is that income-generating activities are few and poverty decreases activity in the community.

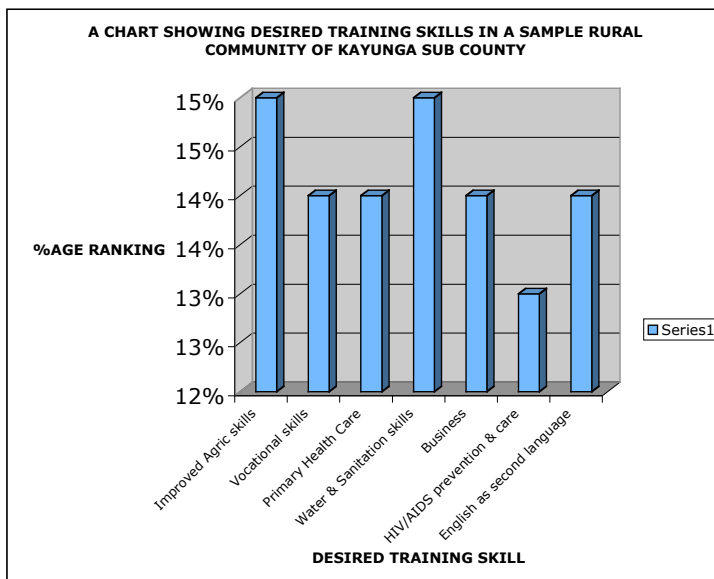


**Donation required.**

You can help the people of these communities get out of poverty by donating a start up of one of the following income generating activities:

- One zero grazer cow: **\$350**
- One goat: **\$45**
- One piglet: **\$20**
- Poultry (a hen and cock): **\$20**
- A tool kit for a vocational skill graduate: **\$100**
- Start up capital for a small retail business: **\$150.**

You can help improve the knowledge levels in each of these focal areas by donating towards the facilitation of a community sensitization workshop.



**Need analysis.**

Despite low literacy levels in the community, respondents are eager to improve their knowledge capacity and greatly support BUVAD's sensitization workshops in the skills identified on the graph.

**Donation required.**

You can support the sensitization of these needy communities by donating one of the following items:

- Stationary material: **\$20**
- Vocational skill training tool: **\$100**
- Vocational skill training material: **\$10**
- Facilitator's allowance per day: **\$15**
- Coordination fees: **\$10**
- Facilitator's day's welfare: **\$5**
